China has adopted aggressive approaches toward neighboring countries and its minority ethnic groups in recent years as its economic and military strength has grown. The global engagement and peaceful transformation policy toward China has proved to be a failure as Beijing's Orwellian strategy has upended regional stability. Taiwanese President Tsai Ing-wen reiterated this in an interview with CNN last month, saying China's ambitions and intentions do not involve only Taiwan.
