# TAIWAN NIGHT MARKET IN SUNSHINE STATE, HELD BY UQ TAISA

Nicknamed the Sunshine State for its warm climate, tropical beaches, and rainforests, Queensland is Australia's second largest state in terms of landmass. Brisbane is a city which hosts the largest population of Taiwanese immigrants than any others in Australia. This is one of the key factors leading to the success of the first-ever Taiwan Festival held in Queensland back in 2012.

In 2019, the Taiwan Festival was transformed into Taiwan Night Market with the focus on the connections among people, food and culture. The event aims to foster the spirit of Taiwan as a community in Queensland. Since the outbreak of COVID-19, plans for the Night Market for 2020 and 2021 had to be suspended. In 2022, the Taiwan Night Market event organised by Taiwanese-Australian Student's Association (TAISA) of University of Queensland had targeted a larger audience by introducing the Queenslanders Taiwanese culture.

From Friday to Saturday 8-9 July, this 2-day event was a success with more than 40,000 people attending. TAISA collaborated with local community and stalls on featuring Taiwanese street food, game alley and live performances.

In addition, information tables were displayed and the advice was provided to the interested individuals from different cultural backgrounds. 'Study in Taiwan' information stall, supported by TECO in Australia, was set up to engage with participants to understand more about Taiwan and its education.

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# 2022 TOCFL SCHEDULE IN AUSTRALIA

In 2022, the Education Division of TECO in Australia will organise tests of Chinese as a foreign language (TOCFL) for non-native speakers of Chinese. 2022 TOCFL is scheduled to take place in Victoria (1 venue) and Queensland (2 venues).

The TOCFL is administrated by the Steering Committee for the Test of Proficiency - Huayu (SC-TOP) in Taiwan on three proficiency bands and six levels, with these being: Band A (Level 1 & Level 2) Band B (Level 3 & Level 4) Band C (Level 5 & Level 6)

Test takers who pass the requirements will receive a certificate. The certificate can serve as a Chinese proficiency credential for the following benefits:

- Applying for the "Ministry of Education (MOE) HES Scholarship" as a reference for 9-months and above award;
- Applying for the "MOE Taiwan Scholarship" to study non-English degree courses;
- Applying for the academic programs at colleges or universities in Taiwan;
- Serving as a reference of Chinese subject for University Entrance Committee for Overseas Chinese Students in Taiwan;
- Serving as a job-required proof of Chinese language proficiency.

# TAIWAN'S MINISTRY OF EDUCATION AND QUEENSLAND DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SIGNED A MOU

Taiwan's Ministry of Education and Queensland Department of Education signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) to promote bilateral exchanges on 7 July, 2022. Since the first MoU was signed in 2013, both parties have continued a well-established educational collaboration and the signing of this MoU would mark a even stronger relationship on education exchanges.

A visual signing ceremony was organised. The MoU was jointly signed by Dr Yen-Yi Lee, director-general of Department of International and Cross-strait Education of Taiwan's Ministry of Education and Mr. Michael De'Ath, directorgeneral of Department of Education Queensland. Delegates of both parties took part in the online ceremony.

The signing ceremony was chaired and conducted by Mr. Stephen Biggs, executive director, Department of Education International, Department of Education of Queensland, with attendance of Edward Tao, director-general from Taipei Economic and Cultural Office (TECO) in Brisbane and Ms Jill Lai, executive director of education division, TECO in Australia.

After the welcoming remarks by Mr Biggs, Mr De'Ath presented a brief speech which highlighted the key objectives of this MoU:


- Endeavour to maintain and enhance bilateral education cooperation between Queensland and Taiwan. To promote our future understanding and realise common benefits through collaborative development and further our understanding of education systems;
- In 2021 there were 122 primary and secondary state schools teaching Chinese language across Queensland. 33,481 students undertook these studies. This MoU will provide further opportunities for Queensland students and educators to strengthen their language skills as well as understanding of multi-culture;
- Provide opportunities for graduate and early career Queensland teachers to travel to Taiwan and gain international experiences of teaching English at Taiwan schools.

Dr Lee concluded the event with a warm welcome to Queensland's educators and officers to visit Taiwan to observe schools and bilingual education in the future.

## INAUGURAL CONFERENCE FOR CHINESE ENGLISH BILINGUAL SCHOOLS

The Intensive Chinese Network (ICN) is an informal network of schools that are committed to the teaching of Chinese beyond the standard recommendation for mainstream Languages curriculum. ICN schools are located across various Australian states and territories and the ICN serves as a platform for professional development tailor-made for the unique contexts and challenges of ICN schools.

ICN schools typically offer Chinese as a subject with significantly more time on task than typical mainstream schools. Furthermore, they also other curriculum area(s) through Chinese, e.g. a school may have 4 sessions of Chinese a week and 4 sessions of science taught in Chinese. The pedagogical approach adopted by these schools is known as Content and Language Integrated Learning (CLIL) and such arrangements allow students to have additional exposure to the language in an authentic and meaningful context.

Some schools in the ICN are also known as Chinese/English bilingual schools. Even though the definition of bilingual schools differs across each state and territory, bilingual schools in Australia typically operate on a partial immersion model, with at least 30% of the curriculum hours being spent in Chinese. Bilingual schools have the ability to create a more immersive environment for language learning by taking language outside of the classroom and balancing the symbolic presence of both English and Chinese in the school.
