Do you want the opportunity to study overseas in an immersive environment?

Are you over 18 and of good moral character?

Then the Ministry of Education (MOE) Huayu Enrichment Scholarship (HES) is for you!

The HES supports Australians to study Mandarin in Taiwan with a monthly stipend of NTD 28,000 (approx. \$1,400 AUD) for a period of 3, 6 or 9 months.



The Taiwan Scholarship supports Australians to pursue a Bachelor's, Master's, or Doctoral degree in Taiwan—all while experiencing a rich and dynamic cultural environment.

Why Apply?

- Generous Financial Support: The scholarship covers tuition and miscellaneous fees up to NTD 40,000 per semester. Additionally, undergraduate students receive a monthly living stipend of NTD 15,000, while master's and PhD students receive NTD 20,000.
- World-Class Education: Taiwan boasts globally recognised universities offering degree programs in English.
- Cultural and Academic Exchange: Studying in Taiwan allows you to immerse yourself in its vibrant society while fostering cross-cultural understanding and friendships.

- Be an Australian citizen with a strong academic record
- Hold a senior high school certificate (Year 12) or a post-secondary degree
- · Demonstrate good moral character

Applications opened on 1st February 2025 and close on 5th May 2025. The selection results will be announced on 3rd June 2025. Successful candidates must submit their university admission letter by 30th June 2025.


